

Facts about the animals for sale...

What is 4-H and FFA?

- They are voluntary programs for the following age groups: 4-H, 9-19 years; FFA, High School Freshman-21 years
 - 4-H is the youth program of the Cooperative Extension Service that is conducted primarily with volunteer leaders
 - FFA is associated with high school agricultural education programs with agriculture as a focus.
 - These organizations provide an educational program that supports the learning which occurs in school. This is accomplished by creating a “hands-on” experience that requires and develops skills in language, mathematics and science.
 - 4-H and FFA provide for well-rounded youth development by involving young people in opportunities for:
 - Leadership*-through club or chapter offices, and committee assignments.
 - Citizenship*-through community service and county, state, national, and international conferences and exchanges.
 - 4-H and FFA require young people to develop strong work habits to complete projects and to learn to work with others to achieve a common goal.



Your decision to purchase an animal at the Pima County Fair 4-H and FFA Livestock Auction can help a young person successfully complete a unique learning experience. The young men and women who raise cavy, pi-geon, poultry, pygmy goat or rabbit in the 4-H and FFA programs have chosen a challenging way to better themselves. Can you be a part of their self improvement? This brochure is designed to explain the details of buying an animal at the 4-H and FFA Livestock Auction.

Members of the 4-H and FFA programs make a commitment to feed and care for their project animals to learn the desirable traits in the species they raise, and how to exhibit in the show ring. Additionally, these young people gain business experience as they manage the funds needed to purchase, feed, and care for the project animal and as they keep records on growth, expenses and income.

The auction culminates several months of work for young people in 4-H and FFA.

They will be better for it and will have developed the self-confidence to help make good decisions in their lives.

We need your help to complete these experiences.



What you need to know to buy at the 4-H and FFA Auction

Where:

In the livestock complex at the Pima County Fairgrounds, 11300 S. Houghton Road.

When:


The last Sunday of the Pima County Fair. This year it is Sunday, April 29, 2018 at 10:30 A.M.

How:

1. Obtain a sale program from the registration table or one of the ring men at the auction. This program tells which member is selling what animal.
2. The auctioneer takes bids for an exhibited lot (one lot is a rabbit, a poultry, pigeon or rabbit meat pen) from anyone attending. Wave your hand, hat, or sale program. (Be careful when waving to friends.)
3. If you are the highest bidder, a sales agreement will be brought to you to verify your purchase and to determine how you will take ownership of the animal.
4. Payment is made at the auction ring.
5. If you cannot come to the auction and would like to purchase an animal, provide your bidder with a letter of authorization to buy for you, or complete the attached "Buyer Authorization Form" and mail it to the address on the form.

What do you do with the purchased animal?

1. You may keep the animal for yourself. You receive a release slip with receipt of payment.
2. If you wish to help a 4-H or FFA member but do not wish to keep the animal, you may donate the animal back to the exhibitor. Check "return to exhibitor" on the sales agreement and the Auction Committee will make the arrangements for you.
3. If you wish to help a 4-H or FFA member but do not wish to keep the animal yourself, you may donate the animal back for resale with the proceeds going to the charitable organization of your choice. Check "re-auction" on the sales agreement and the Auction Committee will make the arrangements for you.
