Steers, Hogs, Lambs, Market Goats

Small Stock Auction - 4/26/26 starts at 10:30 AM
Poultry, Pigeons, Rabbits, Cavies, Pygmy Goats

The process is easy!

1. Come to the live auction at the Pima County Fairgrounds! Get there early! *(If you can't make it but would like someone to bid on your behalf, please reach out to Laura Levin Laura@modernstudios.com.)*
2. Register at the auction table (between the ramada and indoor arena) and receive your number.
3. During the auction, bid on the animals you wish to buy.
4. If you win the bid, you will be presented with a sales contract and decide what you want done with the animal. ***Before you leave, go back to the auction table and pay for the lots you purchased. (NEW for 2026: Payment must be made by the end of the auction by check or credit unless alternate arrangements have been pre-approved by PCJLSI.)***

SMALL STOCK AUCTION:

- a. **Process:** If you wish to have the animal processed, it will be picked up from the auction and you will receive an email as to where and when to pick up your processed animal.
- b. **Donate back to exhibitor:** If you wish to help a 4-H or FFA member, but do not want to keep the animal, you may donate the animal back to the exhibitor.
- c. **Keep for Personal Use:** Animals will need to be picked up in the livestock barn between 6-7 PM on 4/26/26. *Note: Terminal animals should be processed in a timely manner; Poultry broilers/fryers should be processed by 5/1/26 to ensure quality of meat and health of birds.*
